






THE HUMAN COMPUTER



We are not taught the Law of Karma As you sow, so shall you reap! We do not Realize that Life is a Drama We experience trauma and we weep


What is the purpose of our life, on earth?

Our Goal is to know that we are not Mary or John The name was given after we were born Those who don't realize, they will be reborn And this will go on and on and on!




6. I Am Not I. Who Am I?
